SURF AND TURF 2023

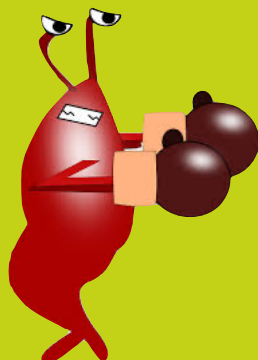
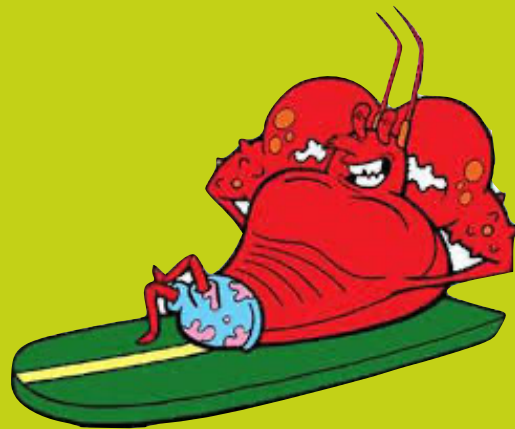
We are very excited to announce the return of the annual Surf and Turf event to be held on Saturday, June 24th at the Baysville Arena.
