#### **Bocce**

- This summer was the largest group we have ever had playing Bocce. The <u>Thursday night</u> session (64 players) filled up during the first two days of registration. Patty Smith volunteered to run a second night on Wednesdays with an additional 16 players.
- The Bocce court's were upgraded this year with Limestone Screening that was donated by Bacher Construction in Dorset. A fellow club member, Tom Priest arranged for the donation from Bacher, and using his tractor, removed the sand and replaced it with the Limestone Screening. Feedback on the upgraded courts was very positive.

#### **Furnace replacement**

The club's oil furnace was red tagged in the spring during the regular maintenance check.
This meant we needed a new furnace. A project team consisting of Dana P, Terry K, Joan
B and Ed M secured and reviewed 5 quotes. They recommended the purchase of a
Keeprite

100,000BTU Propane Furnace from The Sarjeant Co. Ltd. (See August Board meeting Minutes), The Furnace will be installed later this month at a total cost of just under \$7,000.00. Many thanks to the team who worked so quickly and diligently to make this happen before our season starts.

#### **Generating Funds for the Club**


# Fundraising
